

VS.2d, e Geography and the early inhabitants of VA: locations and adapting to the climate and the environment

Teacher Tips:

1. Choose one of the Virginia maps included in this document for copying. A map is inserted below and on page 4. The map page 4 is from the VDOE web site. For easy copying, you can copy and paste the maps onto another Word document, placing 2 on each page.
2. Copy page 3 onto the 8 ½" x 11" sheet of colorful paper that you will use. Fold this paper in ½, hamburger fold. Glue the map to the top side of this colorful page.
3. For the inside of the foldable, cut apart the SET A boxes (page 2). Glue the top part only of the SET A boxes to the matching boxes on page 3, creating a flap. The two matching numbers should create a question/answer or a complete statement. The number codes should make matching easy. Teachers may choose to eliminate the numbers to raise the difficulty level of the task.
4. If you choose the plain VDOE map, you may choose to have the students color code the areas where the three Indian groups lived on the map.
5. Students can add icons or drawings as memory devices, if desired.
