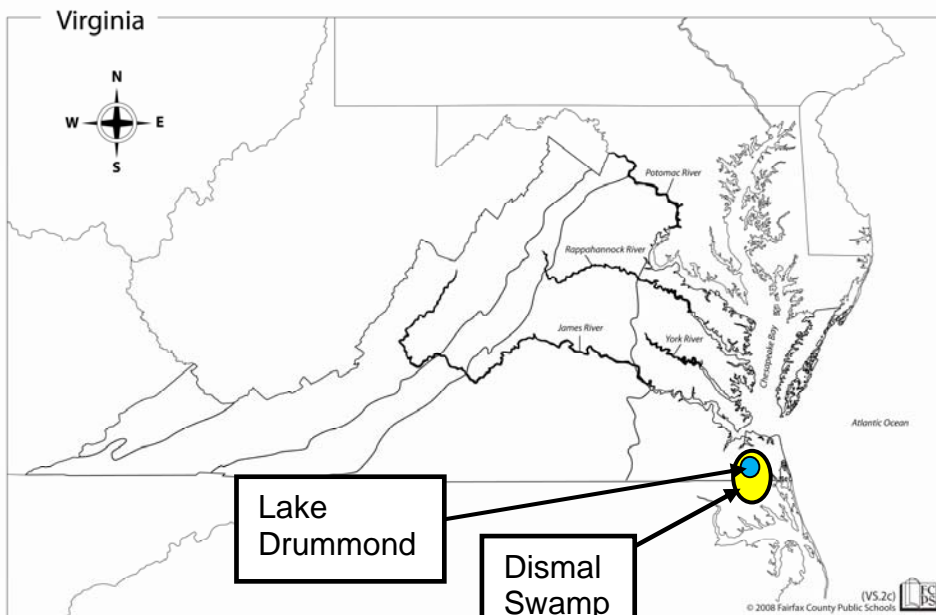


Lake Drummond

Dismal Swamp



Teaching tips:

- Fold a piece of colorful paper in $\frac{1}{2}$ (hot dog fold) and in $\frac{1}{2}$ again (hamburger fold).
- Cut the inside center crease and fold so the cut side is inside and a booklet is constructed with two large tabs on the inside.
- Color the Virginia map, shading each region and coloring the water blue. Also have the students color Lake Drummond and the Dismal Swamp.
- Glue the Virginia map on the front of the booklet as a title.
- Write or glue "Lake Drummond" on one of the inside tabs
- Write or glue "Dismal Swamp" on the other inside tab.
- Have students write details under each tab about features of these two places, or have students select and glue the correct information from the fact strips located below in the VGLA adaptation section.
