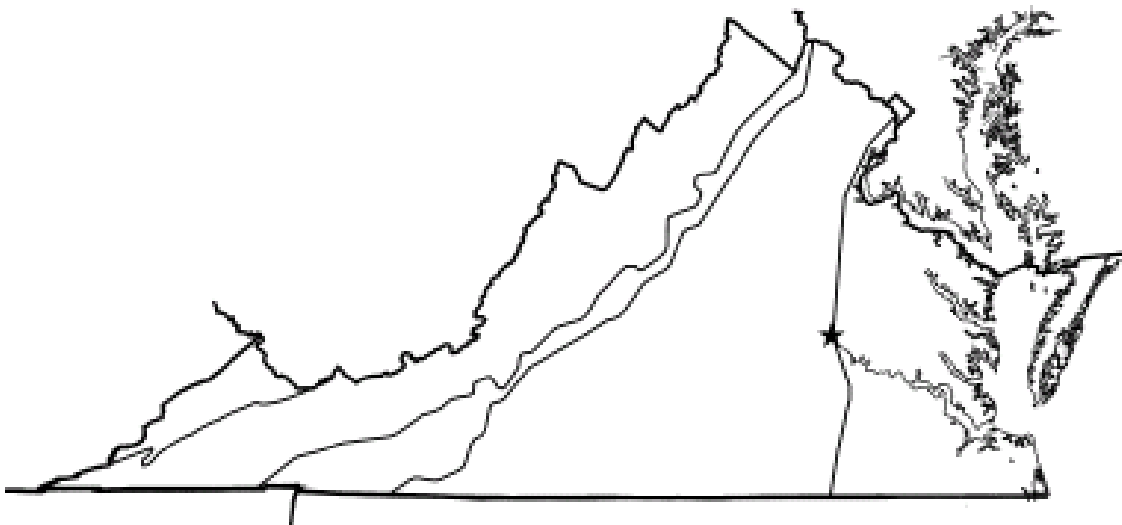


## 2008 SOL VS.2.d, 2.e The Native Peoples of Virginia

### Teacher Tips:

1. Use a Virginia map included in this document for copying, or choose another Virginia map from another source available. A map is inserted below from the VDOE web site. For easy copying, you can copy and paste the maps onto another Word document, placing 2 on each page.
2. Copy page 3 onto the 8½" x 11" sheet of colorful paper that you will use. Fold this paper in ½, hamburger fold. Glue the map to the top side of this colorful page.
3. For the inside of the foldable, cut apart the SET A boxes (page 2). Glue the top part only of the SET A boxes to the matching boxes on page 3, creating a flap. The two matching numbers should create a question/answer or a complete statement. The number codes should make matching easy. Teachers may choose to eliminate the numbers to raise the difficulty level of the task.
4. You may choose to have the students color code the areas where the three Indian groups lived on the map.
5. Students can add icons or drawings as memory devices, if desired.
