

VS.2g Virginia State Recognized Tribes

Teaching Tips:

- Make a pocket book by folding an 8 ½” x 11” piece of paper in ½, hamburger style. White or colored paper may be used.
- Open the fold, and with the valley side facing up, fold the 11” side up to make a 2” flap. Place three thin lines of glue, one on each outer edge of the flap and another one in the middle crease, to make two pockets when the “booklet” is opened. See the photo below for glue placement.
- Glue the title “Current State Recognized Tribes in Virginia” on the front of the pocket book. Glue one label to each pocket inside the booklet. Have students cut apart the tribe cards on the rectangles provided. Slide the cards in the correct side of the pocket, matching the region for each tribe.
- Option: Add more information about each tribe on the back of the card. For more writing space, students could write the tribe names on index cards rather than use the cards below. Refer to pages 1-9 of the *Beyond Jamestown: Virginia Indians Past and Present* for additional information about each tribe. This booklet can be downloaded from the following web link:
