

2008 POS VS.4b Place Names Reflecting Culture

Teaching Tips:

- Copy the template below front to back onto one piece of white or colorful paper, 8 ½" x11". The map will be copied twice so it is on both sides. One side will have the map for the cover and the inside will have the map and the chart as a graphic organizer.
- Fold the paper in half, hamburger fold, along the gray line so that the chart is on the inside of the half book.
- Students select place names found on the map and write them under the English or American Indian labels on the chart to show which culture the name represents. Have students use a different color pencil for each culture.
- Shade or circle the names on the map in the color that matches the color chosen for writing the culture words.
- For an added challenge, students may look on a detailed map of Virginia, adding locations to the map and place names to each list.
- Consider having students shade and label the regions of Virginia on the cover for added reinforcement and review of VS.2b, while shading the place names on the other map that is inside the foldable above the chart.

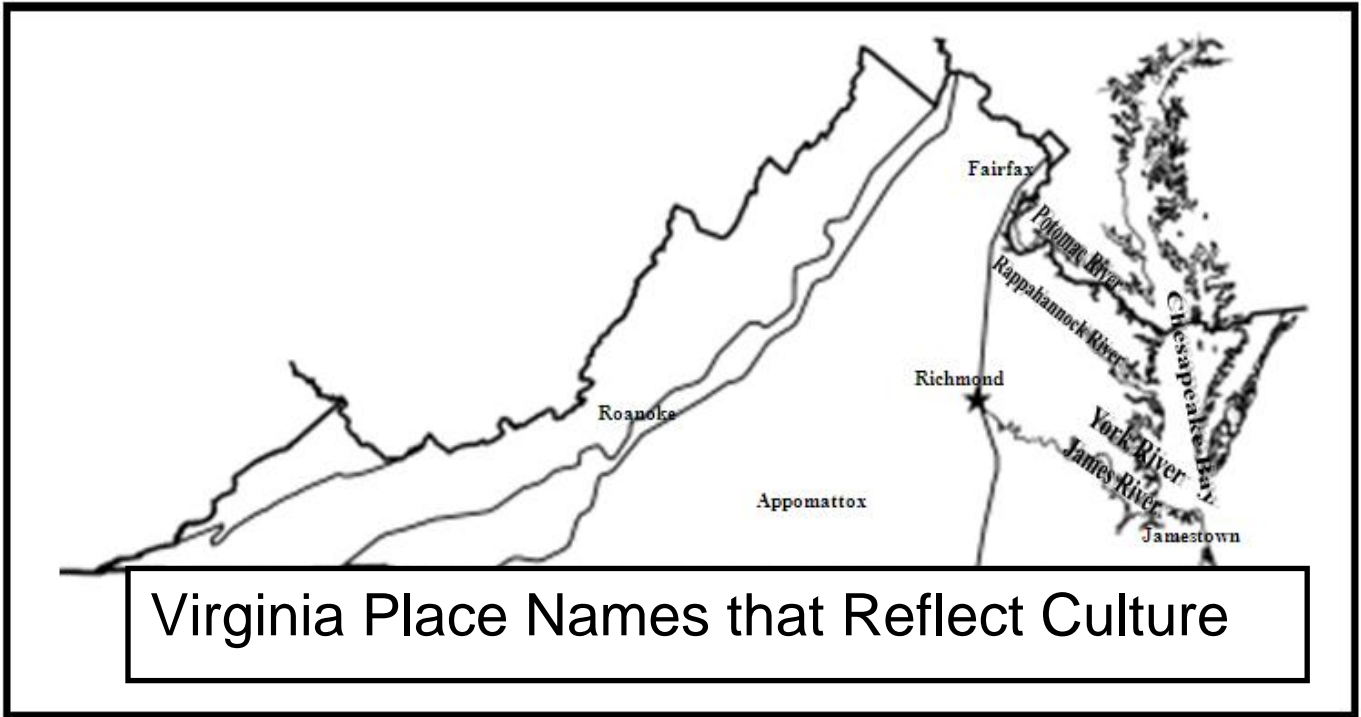
