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### Teacher Tips:

- Use one 8 ½ x 11” sheet of white or colorful copy paper.
- Copy the template, back to front, so that the words who, what, where, when, on page 2, are on one side, and Jack Jouett and the photo, page 1, are on the reverse.
- Students cut on the dotted line to make a square piece of paper.
- Make an envelope fold by first folding a ‘taco’ diagonally.
- Open the folded taco and refold the opposite side to make an “x” crease.
- Open the taco and refold each corner to the middle of the “x” to create a smaller square “envelope” so that “Jack Jouett” is in the center underneath the triangle tabs, inside the envelope”.
- The four triangles with the words who, what, where, when, should appear on top of each envelope triangle after folding.
- Students write facts about Jack Jouett underneath each triangle to match the word on top of that triangle.
- Teachers may choose to copy only page 1, with Jack Jouett in the center, and have students write the who what where when words on the top of the triangles.

### Answer Key:

**Who:** Jouett was a Captain of the Virginia Militia and was stationed in the Charlottesville, Virginia area.

**What:** Jack Jouett rode on horseback to warn Thomas Jefferson, then the governor of Virginia, that the British were coming to arrest him and members of the General Assembly.

**Where:** Jouett rode through the backwoods of Virginia to Monticello, Thomas Jefferson’s home, and then to Cuckoo Tavern in Charlottesville.

**When:** Jouett rode late on June 3, 1781, during the Revolutionary War.
