

2008 POS VS.7b Major Civil War battles fought in Virginia

Teacher Tips:

- This foldable will show the sequence of the Civil War battles in Virginia, as well as the location of the battles on a Virginia map. Each student will need a copy of slides 3, 4, 5, and 6 of this file to make this foldable.
- Fold each page on the dotted lines which folds each page in half, slightly off center, leaving a ½" tab on the bottom. Fold the ½" tab over top and then crease it back so it extends in the opposite direction.
- Form an accordion fold by gluing the straight edge of one part into the valley side of the other sheet's tab. For more explicit directions and a visual on accordion folds, refer to Dinah Zike's *Big Book of Social Studies* or *Big Book of Books*.
- As students glue the pages, make sure to keep the sequence correct, from 1st to last. The pages are numbered.
- Students should fill in the blanks and answer questions posed on the pages. Then, they should shade each map and mark the battle place with a chosen color to have students interact with the maps. Students may add additional drawings to show additional information about each battle or the location of the battle. This process will assist with student memory of the battles and locations.

Have students write a title on the top side (back) of page 1, or cut out and glue the title page, slide 3, if desired. This becomes the "front" when the accordion is closed and is the opposite side of the first map.

Answer Key:

Page 1: Map: **Bull Run (Manassas,)** Nickname: **“Stonewall” Jackson**

Page 2: Map: **Fredericksburg, Virginia.** Lee defeated the **Union** troops.

Page 3: **President Abraham Lincoln** used the Navy to block southern ports.

Page 4: Map: **Richmond.** Fire burned the city of **Richmond.**
Richmond was the capital of the Confederacy.


Page 5: Map: **Near Norfolk and Hampton.** Battle was fought to a **draw.**

Page 6: At **Appomattox Court House**, Virginia, confederate General **Robert E. Lee** surrendered his army to Union General **Ulysses S. Grant.**
