## Varied roles of whites, enslaved African Americans, free African Americans, and American Indians during the Civil War

- White Virginians Most supported the Confederacy.
- **Enslaved African Americans** The Confederacy relied on this group to raise crops and provide labor for the army. Many fled to the Union army as it approached and some fought for the Union.
- **Free African Americans** Some felt their limited rights could best be protected by supporting the Confederacy.
- American Indians Most did not take sides during the Civil War.
